

Legislative Update Washington State Society of Anesthesiologists

The first week of the 2024 legislative session, came to a close with the Senate Health & Long Term Care Committee hearing Senate Bill 5184, establishing licensure of certified anesthesiologist assistants (CAAs). The hearing went well, and opposition was exclusively from CRNAs. WSSA President Tim Clement testified in favor of the bill, as did Dr. Cassie Gabriel from Vancouver. The Medical Commission also testified at the hearing in support of the bill.

On Thursday, WSSA testified on <u>House Bill 2073</u>, legislation proposing to require the Department of Ecology to develop guidelines for the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions (GHGs) from the use of anesthetic gases. While the profession has already taken many steps to limit the use of certain anesthetic gases, per ASA guidelines, WSSA asked the House Environment & Energy Committee to consider amendments to the proposed bill to ensure the preservation of clinical judgment.

Finally, earlier in the week, the Dental Quality Assurance Committee's Anesthesia Committee met to develop FAQs about the administration of anesthetic agents for dental procedures. The updated FAQs can be viewed here.

HB 2066 (SB 5948)	Addressing affordability through health care provider contracting. Prohibits hospitals and health care providers (including physician groups) from engaging in the following contracting tactics: $\hat{a} \in \hat{a} \in \mathcal{A}$ ll-or-nothing clauses $\hat{a} \in \hat{a}$ by which a carrier would be forced to contract with multiple hospitals or affiliates of hospitals. $\hat{a} \in \hat{a} \in \mathcal{A}$ nti-steering clauses $\hat{a} \in \hat{a} \in \mathcal{A}$ by which carriers are restricted from encouraging enrollees to obtain health care services from a competitor of a hospital. $\hat{a} \in \hat{a} \in \mathcal{A}$ nti-tiering clauses $\hat{a} \in \hat{a} \in \mathcal{A}$ by which carriers must place hospitals or affiliate in a certain cost-sharing tier. Violations of the law are enforced by the Attorney General under the consumer protection act, authorizing treble damages in the event of violations.
