

Washington State Society of Anesthesiologists Legislative Report

Today (Friday, February 21) is the deadline for legislative policy committees to approve bills, sending them on either to a fiscal committee or to their chamber's Rules Committee, for further review. This is the first cutoff of the session.

Fiscal committees, primarily the Ways & Means Committee in the Senate and Appropriations in the House, along with each chamber's Transportation Committee, will have until next Friday, February 28, to hear and approve policy bills affecting one of the three budgets: operating, transportation or capital.

There were a flurry of bills getting last-minute consideration today, with the House and Senate Health Care Committees advancing 21 bills just this morning.

Although we are still about a month away from the state's next revenue forecast, legislative leaders are beginning to talk to the public about the state of our budget situation. House Democrats have <u>soft launched a link</u> to the Inslee "Book 1" budget, which assumed no new revenue and relied solely on cuts to balance the books. Their goal is to push back against the narrative from "<u>Budget Breakdown</u>," an effort organized by Enterprise Washington, which conveys the message that our budget woes are the result of over-spending. A <u>recent poll</u> indicated that nearly 60% of voters blame the budget shortfall on uncontrolled spending, but Democrats hope that demonstrating what may be on the chopping block if they're forced to adopt a no-revenue budget will help turn the tide.

Governor Ferguson is also expected to make some announcements next week about his perspective on the budget.

Several important health care-related bills remain viable this session, including legislation to create a health care provider registry, a bill regulating the corporate practice of medicine, and a proposal to reimburse PAs and ARNPs the same rates as physicians. However, a bill related to hospital mergers (HB 1881) failed to receive a vote in the House Civil Rights & Judiciary Committee before today's deadline and is technically dead for this year. Bills proposing to regulate the medicinal use of psilocybin also did not advance.
