

Washington State Society of Anesthesiologists Legislative Report

The legislative session is now more than halfway over, and lawmakers passed a major deadline this week. Wednesday, March 12th was the chamber of origin cutoff, which is when any legislation must be passed from the entire body in which it was introduced in order to remain viable. There are exceptions, of course, including revenue proposals or other bills considered "necessary to implement the budget" (NTIB). Legislation considered NTIB is not subject to the deadlines in a session, and bills are viable until the final days. There is no official list of NTIB bills, which is why no bill is ever truly dead as long as lawmakers are in Olympia.

The House of Representatives worked until late night/early morning several days during the first half of March, including the final cutoff day when they adjourned past 2 a.m. Last Saturday night, they debated a bill about communicable disease until 1:30 a.m. The Senate conducted its work between 10-5 most days and often adjourned early.

Legislation to increase Medicaid reimbursement rates for physicians (HB 1392) was not advanced from the House but <u>is</u> NTIB and not subject to Wednesday's deadline. Legislation regulating the corporate practice of Medicine died in the Senate and another bill about creating a health care registry was turned into a study. The PEBB/SEBB rate cap bill is still very much alive, but it does not apply to professional services in hospitals.

One of the more contentious bills still viable this session is HB 1430, which proposes to require commercial health plans to reimburse PAs and APRNs the same rate as physicians. Before it passed out of the House on a party-line vote last week, the bill was narrowed to apply only to APPs working in behavioral health and primary care. CRNAs, who testified in favor of the bill earlier this session, were carved out. The bill has not yet been scheduled for a public hearing in the Senate Health & Long Term Care Committee.

Next week, the Economic & Revenue Forecast Council will provide the quarterly economic and revenue forecast. The following week (March 24), the House and Senate are both expected to release their proposed operating budgets. Both budgets are expected to rely on some form of new revenue, which means the various tax proposals being considered will likely be scheduled for public hearings following the budget releases.

The next cutoff date for the session is April 2^{nd} , when bills must advance from committee in the opposite chamber to remain viable.
