The 2020 election is coming up soon and we want physicians' views to be at the front of their thoughts as they campaign. **PAPAC** and **WAMPAC** are the nonpartisan campaign arms of the WSSA and WSMA respectively. After passage of HB 1065 earlier this year, implementation of the law prohibiting balance billing has been moving forward. The law directed the compilation of a dataset from the state's all-payer claims database to inform arbitration decisions under the law when physician groups and insurance carriers engage in dispute resolution to determine what constitutes "commercially reasonable" reimbursement. There has been concern among the physician community about the draft dataset. The final dataset is pending and we will keep you posted as more information becomes available.
